#### FROM THE RABBI

**Events Beyond Our Control** 

You've probably heard the expression "Change is the only constant," and I believe that's true. And according to the Torah, the only things in this world that are permanent and eternal are God, the Torah, and the Jewish people – Am Yisrael Chai.

Over the last few months, our community has been challenged in ways we never anticipated, with the everunfolding events in Israel and the news of Chabad coming to Wakefield. Both situations provoked feelings of worry and despair in our community, simultaneously fearing for the future of Israel as well as that of our 76-year community in Wakefield. But I believe strongly in the words of Rabbi Akiva – gam zu l'tov – that "this, too, is for the best." When things seem to be at their darkest and scariest, Jewish tradition teaches us not to fear, but rather to find the light.

Events in Israel are, sadly, far beyond our control. What has been proven since October 7th is that America is Israel's staunchest ally, through thick and thin. Despite anti-Israel protests all over the country, all our elected leaders in Washington, both Democrat and Republican, steadfastly support Israel in its war against Hamas and Hezbollah.

And even though it's much more local, Chabad's arrival this Spring is also beyond our control. For the first time in the history of Wakefield, there will be TWO synagogues. Chabad must believe that there are unaffiliated Jewish people in our neck of the woods, and they seek to capitalize! What if they're right – that there are Jewish people in Wakefield, Reading, Saugus, and Stoneham that are looking for a spiritual home? Rather than fearing about a scarcity of Jews, we can approach Chabad's entry to Wakefield with an attitude of abundance, as they are.

On Monday, January 16th, Wakefield Human Rights Commission remembered Martin Luther King and his wife Coretta at the Galvin Middle School. The theme of this year's program was sharing the optimisim of the Kings on MLK Day. There were poems and stories told as well as the talented dancers of OrigiNation.

Rabbi Greg Hersh gave the invocation noting that "it is easier to do nothing than something and hate than love. It would have been easier to stay home on a cold day than come here, but you didn't." Dr. King didn't take the easy way out. He forced America to reckon with its lofty goals despite racism and his work isn't done. We

still struggle with this. We must still combat racism and hatred of the other. May we be the light that drives out darkness. May we be the love that drives out hate.' Later in the program, Rabbi Greg led the audience in a sing-a-long of TEACH YOUR CHILDREN by Graham Nash.

No matter what the future brings, we will continue to fulfill our mission of being a proud, welcoming, and joyful Jewish community in Wakefield.


